Worsening Road Risks for Merseyside's Pedestrians and Cyclists

The Department for Transport published its annual report (for 2012) on road casualties at the end of last month. This showed a further deterioration in reported serious injuries to Merseyside's pedestrians and cyclists:

- serious or fatal injuries to pedestrians increased by 11% to 211, again constituting the highest figures (per head of population) in Great Britain
- serious or fatal injuries to cyclists increased by 16% to 85, which is a 16-year high
- taken together, pedestrians and cyclists formed 52% of the total serious or fatal injuries.

Wirral Pedestrian Association and Merseyside Cycle Campaign are issuing a joint statement in response. They are calling for a new approach, one that aims to eradicate all fatal and serious injuries to pedestrians and cyclists. The attached document sets out **a vision of zero serious casualties** caused by motor vehicles, which we feel is the only acceptable approach for pedestrians and cyclists - the most vulnerable of users on our roads.

They welcome:

- comments on how this vision can be improved
- expressions of support and/or of a willingness to work in partnership
